- Beans (Provider Bean or Kentucky Wonder Pole Bean)
- Beets (Detroit Medium Red Top or Burpee's Golden)
- Carrot (Hercules)
- Cucumbers (Marketmore 76)
- Lettuce (All Lettuce Mix)
- Peas (Sugar Snap)
- Radish (Easter Egg)
- Spinach (Space)
- Zucchini (Black) or Yellow Squash (Yellow Crook)
- Winter Squash (Table Queen Acorn or Waltham Butternut)
- Swiss Chard (Bright Lights) or Arugula
- Mustard Greens (Green Wave)
- Collard (Champion)
- Turnips (Purple Top)
- All Greens Mix or Okra (Clemson Spineless)

### HOT CROP TRANSPLANTS PICK UP MID-MAY

- Tomatoes (Pink Beauty, Amish Paste, Cherokee Purple, Brandywine, Green Zebra, Washington cherry, Gold nugget, Stripped German)
- Bunching Onion (Evergreen Hardy White)
- Hot Pepper (Early Jalapeno & Joe's Long Cayenne)
- Sweet Pepper (King of the North, Orange Bell, Sunray Bell)
- Cantaloupe (Sweet Granite), Honeydew (Diplomat) or Watermelon (Crimson Sweet)
- Eggplant (Nadia) or Tomatillo (Toma Verde) or Ground Cherry (Goldie)
- Herbs (parsley (Italian Dark Green) & Basil (Genovese))
- Flowers (Calendula, Marigold, Benary Giant Zinnia)
